Lawton Ballet Theatre's Choreography Concert



LET'S TALK ABOUT IT


The McMahon Auditorium Authority, in collaboration with the City of Lawton Arts and Humanities Division, The City of Lawton, and Cameron University, is excited to announce the launch of the new series theme of Let's Talk About It, "The Oklahoma Experience: Looking For Home."







Let's Talk About It is a four-part scholar-led discussion group that brings books to life and encourages thought-provoking discussions. This series is made possible through funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities and aims to explore the literary response to the social changes of that era.



The series continues on Thursday, April 18, at 6:00 p.m. with the reading of Walking on Borrowed Land by William A. Owens. The discussion will be led by East Central University Professor Dr. Ken Hada in the Cameron University Library.

City of Lawton Trash Off

The City of Lawton and the Lawton Enhancement Trust Authority hosted its annual Trash Off event on Saturday, April 6, 2024, in the parking lot of McMahon Memorial Auditorium.

Citizens were encouraged to bring unwanted debris and recyclable items. This event was free for Lawton residents, and active-duty military. Others were welcome with a \$25 fee.

John Denney Play House

The John Denney Playhouse, located at 1316 NW Bell Ave in Lawton, is owned by the City of Lawton and is occupied by Lawton Community Theatre through a lease agreement with the City.

It suffered significant damage during the June 2023 hailstorm and the roof sustained severe damage, nearly rendering the building uninhabitable. However, with the City Manager's approval, funds from the City's insurance are being utilized to repair the roof. The Oklahoma State Contractor has been scheduled to commence work on the building in the coming weeks.



Additionally, the Arts and Humanities Office and McMahon Auditorium Authority have collaborated with a local contractor to remove a substantial amount of damaged interior drywall. Despite the ongoing repairs, the building continues to serve as storage space for Lawton Community Theatre. In the meantime, their performances are hosted at McMahon Memorial Auditorium under a temporary support agreement with the Authority until their space is fully restored.

CARNIGIE LIBRARY TOWN HALL



Thanks to the City of Lawton's support, the ADA Ramp is undergoing enhancements to both its appearance and security. The City of Lawton Parks and Recreation Department, in collaboration with the Arts and Humanities office and the McMahon Auditorium Authority, has successfully secured competitive bids for several upgrades.

These include installing a Cast-Iron fence around the ADA Ramp and tunnel, along with a new access gate. Additionally, a separate contractor will be painting the ramp's underside, the tunnel's ceiling, and repainting the handrails.

These improvements aim to improve access to Lawton's Umbrella Art Organization, Arts for All. In recent months, Arts for All has already made significant enhancements to its space, such as adding fresh paint and installing art rails for hanging artwork
