The theme chosen for the NEA Big Read Grant was centered around Native American heritage month and focused on Pulitzer Prize finalist's There There by Tommy Orange.


During the entire month of November, in collaboration with several partners McMahon Auditorium Authority hosted a variety of events with several guest speakers, such as Native American Story Telling told by Wallace Moore, Native American Poetry spoken by Keely Record, and Play 49 - a play about Native culture with a cast representing several tribes.

The Museum of the Great Plains, McMahon Auditorium Authority, and City of Lawton Arts and Humanities Division are excited to host a Lawton Premier of Washington's Armor on January 13th, 2023, at McMahon Memorial Auditorium.

Washington's Armor was the first major production filmed in Lawton since it achieved the 'Film Friendly' certification by completing the requirements of the Oklahoma Film Friendly Community Program in 2021.





There will be three showings, two during the day for students at 10:00 a.m. and 12:15 p.m., and one evening show for the general public at VIPS at 7:00 p.m., all at McMahon Memorial Auditorium.

Lawton middle and high schools are encouraged to sign up for this event and participate in the historical, patriotic adventure film trilogy depicting the difficult journey of young George Washington 20 years before the revolutionary war.
