



The Art Purchase Competition Award, sponsored by the McMahon Auditorium Authority, provides an opportunity for artists to showcase their talents. The McMahon Auditorium Authority Arts and Humanities Committee will serve as the jury, selecting three pieces of artwork from one artist. These chosen artworks will be presented to the three winners of the 2023 Lawton Cultural Awards, and the artist will receive a prize of \$900.00 for their three pieces.
